Poompuhar- Ancient port city

- · News: Ancient port city of Poompular traced undersea.
- The present-day Poompuhar in Tamil Nadu's Mayiladuthurai district was once a flourishing port city known as Kaveripoompattinam which was later submerged by the sea. There are references to this port in the Tamil epic Manimekalai.
- To go back to the history of Poompuhar, it was a busy port of Sangam age Chola kings. (The Sangam age is datable from the third century BCE to third century CE). It reportedly flourished about 2,500 years ago.
- The port was situated near the mouth of the Cauvery. Merchants from different parts of India and South East Asia traded goods there.
- Poompuhar is celebrated in Sangam age poems such as Silappadhikaram, Manimegalai, Pattinappalai, Purananuru and Agananuru. The city was ruled by Sangam age Chola rulers such as Hanchetchenni, Killivalavan, Karikalvalavan and others.


