



Advanced Sewage Wastewater treatment

- News: India is adopting advanced sewage wastewater treatment technology
- Most sewage treatment plants in India used to rely on outdated technologies such as the activated sludge process, planted drying beds, soil biotechnology and upflow anaerobic sludge blanket reactors that have a treatment efficiency of around 65 per cent and are cumbersome to set up and manage.
- The story is slowly changing with several states in recent years opting for newer technologies — sequencing batch reactors (SBRs) and moving bed biofilm reactors (MBBRs).
